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# Message from the President

**AWMH-Maharashtra** has had a productive year, significantly advancing its mission through new initiatives. We successfully operated five Early Intervention centers across Mumbai suburbs, including Dombivli, Mulund, Ghatkopar, Mankhurd, and Khetwadi. These centers provide a comprehensive range of services, such as special education, occupational therapy, speech therapy, counseling for parents, and training programs for home-based care. The programs are designed to be family-centric, developmentally appropriate, and supportive, promoting significant developmental progress in children from birth to six years old. Throughout the year, the centers have seen a steady influx of participants, with monthly registrations indicating robust engagement across all locations. In addition to internal growth, **AWMH-Maharashtra** has collaborated with Vatsalya Trust, which provided orthotics to 12 children, enhancing the physical support available to the beneficiaries.

Our focus on staff education has been maintained, with monthly training sessions covering various aspects of early intervention and special education. Further, we had formal training for specific Learning Disability, AAP devices and Documentation for select resources who are working in that area. These sessions are crucial for refining the skills of our therapists, teachers, and psychologists, ensuring they remain at the forefront of developmental therapy practices.

Parental involvement has been another key focus, with multiple meetings held to inform and educate parents about government schemes, the psychological aspects of disability, and available support systems. These meetings are part of AWMH's holistic approach, which integrates community support with specialized intervention strategies. We were selected by TCS for developing an online system for our EI care. The system is under development and likely to be operational by Sept 2024 and will substantially enhance capacity of our service providers to plan services and analyses of child's progress.

**AWMH Maharashtra** has been actively promoting sports as a crucial component of holistic development for individuals with Intellectual Disabilities The organization hosted several major tournaments this year, including the 14th Maharashtra State Table Tennis Tournament and the 17th Maharashtra State Cricket Tournament. These events, supported by notable organizations such as the Rotary Club of Mumbai Versova and the Dalal Family Foundation, drew participation from numerous special schools across the state, fostering not only competition but also inclusion and personal growth among participants.

In addition to hosting events, **AWMH Maharashtra** ran a weekend sports coaching program that included carrom, basketball, and cricket, helping students hone their skills in a structured environment. The coaching sessions were designed to improve specific sports skills while also encouraging teamwork and physical fitness. The success of these programs highlights AWMH's commitment to using sports as a vehicle for enhancing the lives of those with intellectual disabilities, underpinning the belief that every participant is a winner.

The AWMH RAC plays an important role in fostering social interaction and community engagement among individuals with disabilities. Throughout the year, the center has hosted a variety of sessions and events aimed at enhancing both physical and social skills of its members. Activities range from yoga and laughter exercises to more focused group games and craft sessions, all designed to promote coordination, communication, and wellbeing. Significant events include birthday celebrations with enjoyable visits to popular venues like McDonald's, where participants not only enjoy meals but engage in communal celebrations that enhance their social experience. Regular sessions also involve creative activities such as making origami photo frames and designing face-masks, which support fine motor skills and artistic expression. Moreover, the RAC's calendar is punctuated with special occasions like Diwali and Christmas parties, where members engage in dancing, games, and shared meals, highlighting the center's commitment to creating a supportive, joyous community environment.

Together we will make strides with new initiatives in 2024 -2025 to propel AWMH further in the service of children and adults with intellectual disabilities.

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**AWMH, Maharashtra** is running 5 Early Intervention (EI) centres across Mumbai Suburbs Like Dombivli, Mulund, Ghatkopar, Mankhurd and Khetwadi centre. Early intervention services give **specialized support** to children and families in the early years (from birth to school entry 6 yr.). This support includes

- Special Education
- Occupational Therapy
- Speech Therapy
- Counseling to parents
- Training parents for home bound programs
- Developmental And Psychological Assessment

**All** the programs or sessions aimed at promoting child's development. Any Intervention selected for a child is Family centric, Developmentally Appropriate, child focused, supportive and structured. The Transdisciplinary team is characterized by the commitment of its members to teach, learn, and work together to implement coordinated services.

## 6. Internship



Warm-up and exercises preceded the regular training session, which was followed by cricket skills like throwing and catching. AWMH Maharashtra in association with The Dalal Family Foundation (USA) organised 17<sup>th</sup>Maharashtra State Cricket Tournament

for the special schools in Maharashtra.

The Cricket Tournament was held on 06th Feb, 2024. Both the venues Prabodhan Krida Bhavan and Goregaon Sports Club for Cricket tournament were already booked for the event. Teams were categorized into Group A, Group B and Group C. From 8 districts of Maharashtra 58 schools with 216 students (12 teams) &48 teachers were part of this tournament. Five students from Sports Recreation Centre were part of Mumbai Suburb Cricket team in the B and C category.

The Ability grouping of the team was decided on the basis of previous Tournament performance. The Required Cricket circular was circulated on the 07th Dec-23 to all the schools The officials (Match Referee, umpires) were informed about the Cricket Tournament venue, dates and reporting time.

This year we introduced girl participants in Group C category. There were four girls in each team in which two girls were the part of playing eleven and two were substitute. We are looking forward to conduct girls Cricket tournament in future. This will motivate girls training program for Cricket in all the schools

This year AWMH Maharashtra raised the prize money for all the categories. The winner was awarded Rs. 8000/- and runner up Rs. 6000/- in all the three categories. Cash prizes for the best batsman, bowler, fielder and man of the tournament was given Rs. 1500/- in all the three categories. All the participating teams were given full cricket kit (Track Pant, T-Shirt and cap). Keeping into consideration

JJ Hospital also was receptive to our proposal as we did operate one EI centre where we had a very useful and valued partnership with their Pediatric Wards for providing Early Intervention Care and Therapy to affected infants and children.
- **e)** List of Active & Passive members' register of AWMH Maharashtra has been prepared. This is normally prepared before AGM of that FY

**f)** This year AWMH went in for a new EIRP folder featuring all important points related to identifying and helping children with delayed milestone. New Brochure was presented before the Committee members for their inputs or any changes that were required. Also it was decided the brochure would be translated in Marathi for better reach amongst parents and other stake holders.

Prior to that we had invited three bids for the sale as per rules and regulations on the **Hon. Charity Commissioners Office.** Meanwhile process of Land acquisition by PMRDA is already in its initial stages and unanimously it was decided that we should not proceed with the sale of land as it was expected that the sale to PMRDA Dept. would fetch a desired amount benefiting us

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
